S278 A51 & Little Tixall Lane, Great Haywood - Highway works

The highway works for S278 A51 & Little Tixall Lane, Great Haywood is programmed to start on the 27th July 2020 for approximately 20 weeks and will be delivered by Amey Highways.

S278 A51 and Little Tixall Lane is associated with the residential development off Little Tixall Lane, Great Haywood and includes the construction of a new priority junction and access road off the A51 together with but not limited to;

- Re-alignment and re-profiling of Little Tixall Lane east to include passing places.
- Provision of retaining walls on the proposed Access Road and Little Tixall Lane East
- Provision of an attenuation storage pond between Little Tixall Lane east and the A51.
- Provision of equestrian holding pens on the new access road.
- Provision of a bus stop on the A51 south-east of the new junction.
- Implementation of three Traffic Regulation Orders:
 - Speed limit reduction on Little Tixall Lane
 - o Speed Limit reduction on A51 Lichfield Road
 - Prohibition of motor vehicles on Little Tixall Lane West (between the new access and Marlborough Close)
- Associated service diversions and installation of new services.

Enclosed is a copy of the scheme plan (CDD3006-R01-01-C0 General Arrangement) which details the proposals.

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To undertake the works safely there will be a variety of traffic management measures used, including the closure of Little Tixall Lane for vehicles and pedestrians and traffic signal control on the A51 when required.

Little Tixall Lane will be closed for vehicles and pedestrians from Marlborough Close to the junction of Little Tixall Lane and Coley Lane for the duration of the works and the diversion route is shown on the enclosed plan 'TM-LITI-STAF-02'.

Although every endeavour will be made to minimise disturbance, we apologise for any inconvenience caused to the public during this period.
